|               | During National Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month, we renew<br>our efforts to educate all Americans about the tragic consequences of impaired<br>driving and encourage all Americans to drive responsibly.   |
|               | Every year, too many of our citizens get behind the wheel of an automobile<br>after drinking alcohol or using drugs. This puts drivers, passengers, and<br>others on the road at risk. Last year alone, drunk driving killed more than<br>16,000 people and accounted for more than 30 percent of all motor vehicle<br>deaths.  |
|               | My Administration remains committed to saving lives and preventing injuries<br>resulting from drunk and drugged driving. The Department of Transpor-<br>tation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration oversees the "You<br>Drink & Drive. You Lose." program, which educates our citizens about<br>the dangers of driving under the influence. This campaign also encourages<br>lifesaving measures to help keep impaired drivers off the road—including<br>sobriety checkpoints, saturation patrols, and prosecution of those who break<br>the law. To protect our Nation's young people and deter underage drinking,<br>the Helping America's Youth initiative, led by First Lady Laura Bush, is<br>promoting positive youth development and educating our children about<br>the dangers associated with alcohol and drug use. With the help of parents,<br>educators, and faith-based and community organizations, this initiative teach-<br>es our children to avoid alcohol and drug use, make healthy choices, and<br>build lives of purpose. |
|               | Keeping drunk and drugged drivers off the road is vital for the safety<br>of our loved ones and fellow citizens. All Americans can encourage respon-<br>sible actions and work to ensure that those around them do not operate<br>a vehicle while under the influence. When law enforcement, communities,<br>and individuals unite against impaired driving, lives are saved and our<br>Nation's roadways are made safer for everyone.  |
