POLICY JUSTIFICATION

Greece – AGM-114 HELLIFIRE Missiles

The Government of Greece has requested a possible sale of 633 AGM-114K1 HEAT HELLFIRE II missiles, 24 AGM-114M1 Blast Fragmentation Warhead Missiles, 3 M36E HELLFIRE II Training missiles, 3 M34 HELLFIRE Drill missiles, publications, technical support, and related elements of logistics support. The estimated cost is \$66 million.

This proposed sale will contribute to the foreign policy and national security objectives of the United States by improving the military capabilities of Greece and further weapon system standardization and interoperability with U.S. forces.

Greece needs these missiles in order to defend its own borders and to remain militarily viable in the region. The proposed sale of HELLFIRE missiles will greatly improve Greece's defense posture. The missiles will be provided in accordance with, and subject to the limitation on use and transfer provided under the Arms Export Control Act, as amended, as embodied in the Letter of Offer and Acceptance.

Greece, which already has HELLFIRE missiles in its inventory, will have no difficulty absorbing the additional missiles.

This proposed sale will not adversely affect either the military balance in the region or U.S. efforts to encourage a negotiated settlement of the Cyprus questions.

The prime contractor will be HELLFIRE Systems Limited Liability Company of Orlando, Florida. The purchaser has requested offsets; agreements are undetermined and will be defined in negotiations between the purchaser and contractor.

Implementation of this proposed sale will not require the assignment of any additional U.S. Government or contractor representatives to Greece.

There will be no adverse impact on U.S. defense readiness as a result of this proposed sale.

(vii) Sensitivity of Technology:

- 1. The highest level for release of the HELLFIRE II is Secret, based upon the software. The highest level of classified information that could be disclosed by a proposed sale or by testing of the end item is Secret; the highest level that must be disclosed for production, maintenance, or training is Confidential. Vulnerability data, countermeasures, vulnerability/susceptibility analyses, and threat definitions are classified Secret or Confidential. Reverse engineering could reveal confidential information. Susceptibility of HELLFIRE II to diversion or exploitation is considered low risk. Components of the system are also considered highly resistant to reverse engineering.
- 2. The Government of Greece is expected to afford all system related information and technologies the same degree of protection given to it by the United States.

CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO § 620C(d) OF THE FOREIGN ASSISTANCE ACT OF 1961, AS AMENDED

Pursuant to § 620C(d) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended (the Act), Executive Order 12163 and State Department Delegation of Authority No. 145, I hereby certify that the sale of defense articles and defense services, to include 633 AGM-114K1 HEAT HELLFIRE II missiles, 24 AGM-114M1 Blast Fragmentation Warhead Missiles, 3 M36E HELLFIRE II Training missiles, 3 M34 HELLFIRE Drill missiles and other related elements of program support to the Government of Greece is consistent with the principles set forth in § 620C(b) of the Act.

This certification will be made part of the notification to Congress in accordance with § 36(b) of the Arms Export Control Act, as amended, regarding the proposed sale of the above-named articles and services and is based on the justification accompanying said notification, of which said justification constitutes a full explanation.
