The Exchange proposes to amend the NYSE Arca Equities Fees and Charges ("Fee Schedule") by introducing new Tier 6 under the Adding Tiers pricing table and adopt Tiers 1, 2 and 3 under the new Sub-Dollar Adding Tiers pricing table.
